



The aims of art education are to enable every child to:




- Enjoy art,

Students discover and explore their environment, building the capacity to critically discuss & process visual information.








In addition, through learning folk dances and folk songs from European and Asian countries, giving students the exposure to different cultures since young to cultivate appreciation for world music.
