### D. START OF SCHOOL 2023: REMINDERS AND EXPECTATIONS

### **D1 PUNCTUALITY AND ATENDANCE**

Primary 1 students are to report to school on 3 January 2023. Primary 2-6 students will report to school on 4 January 2023. Students are strongly encouraged to arrive early, by 7.30 a.m., to assemble at the Parade Square (Monday – Wednesday) or in the classroom (Thursday & Friday, or on rainy days).

Students who arrive after 7.40 a.m. will be marked as late for attendance. Repeated late-coming will affect a student's conduct grade.

All students will be dismissed at 1.30 p.m. Monday to Friday.

\*\*Primary 1 students will be dismissed at 1.15 pm in Week 1 (4 - 6 January ).

Students who are not feeling well should not report to school and should see a doctor. Parents must inform the school office or form teacher and follow up with the medical certificate issued by the clinic. Students who are absent from school without a valid reason will be marked as truant for attendance.

# **D2 EXPECTATIONS**

<u>Attire</u>

With the loosening of the Safe Management Measures (SMMs), students will wear the school uniform. On days when there are PE or PAL lessons, students are to be in PE attire.

As per the notification on 1 Dec, there are changes to the school uniform design. Students may continue to wear the old uniforms till they have outgrown them. Boys wearing the old uniform must tuck it in.

The name tag must be placed centred above the school crest. For the boy's uniform, it should be placed above the shirt pocket.

Students must be neat and properly attired in their school uniform at all times. Students must wear white shoes and white socks. The length of the socks should cover the ankles.

Students are to wear the prescribed school uniform and modifications to the uniform are not allowed.

Please refer to the PDF attachment (Annex 1) for pictures of the uniform.

#### Personal Grooming

For girls, hair accessories must be either black or dark blue. Hair that reaches the uniform's collar must be tied up neatly. Fringe must be neatly maintained above the eyebrows; if necessary, with simple black hairpins. Only identical stud earrings are allowed.

For boys, hair must be kept short and neat at the back and sides. Hair styles should be simple and neat. Unusual styles such as undercut, shaved patterns, or combed-back long fringes are not permitted.

### **D3 DEVICES AND PROHIBITED ITEMS**

Students are discouraged from bringing smart devices such as mobile phones and smart watches to school. Students are to be responsible for their smart devices. The school will not be held responsible for any damaged or missing devices.

Devices should be turned off or on silent mode during curriculum hours unless specific instruction is given by teachers. Students are only allowed to use their devices to make personal phone calls after school, and only at the canteen or the foyer.

Parents should contact the school office if they need to reach their children or pass a message to them.

### E. PRE-MORNING ASSEMBLY ACTIVITIES

In line with developing the students holistically, the following pre-morning assembly activities would be in place for 2023 from 7.15 am to 7.35 am daily. As part of the school's Bilingual Reading Programme, RMPS would like to promote a love for reading in our students in order to raise their language proficiency. Therefore, students will need to bring an English Language story book on Mondays and Tuesdays, and a Mother Tongue Language story book on Wednesdays and Thursdays, for reading before morning assembly.

Friyay!@RMPS is an initiative which focuses on strengthening bonds and building friendships through play. Students will be allowed to play educational games like Chess, Rubik's cube, Traffic Rush, Boggle, Scrabble, Snakes & Ladders and Reversi before morning assembly. Please note that electronic devices will not be allowed. Students are responsible for the personal games that they bring to the school on Fridays. We seek your strong support and partnership in this initiative to develop responsibility in our students.

# H3 TRAFFIC MATTERS

# Students Alighting Along Lower Delta Road at Arrival

If you drive your child(ren)/ ward(s) to school in the morning, please do not allow him/ her/ them to alight along the Lower Delta Road and/ or Bukit Purmei Avenue as it poses a danger to him/ her/ them and other road users and is a hindrance to smooth traffic flow. Please drive into RMPS via Bukit Purmei Avenue so that your child(ren)/ ward(s) can alight at the foyer safely. We seek your understanding and cooperation to ensure his/ her/ their safety and well-being, as well as to be socially responsible by playing your part to prevent traffic congestion along Lower Delta Road and Bukit Purmei Avenue.

### Strictly For Drop Off And Pick Up At The School Foyer

To facilitate the smooth flow of vehicles driving into RMPS for students to alight at arrival and for parents to pick up him/ her/ them at dismissal, please take note of the "STRICTLY FOR DROP OFF AND PICK UP" sign at the foyer. If you drive your child(ren)/ ward(s) to school, please ensure that his/ her/ their bags are with them so that he/ she/ they can alight quickly on his/ her/ their own, at the foyer. This will ease traffic congestion leading into RMPS and minimise the wait time of other parents who are also driving their child(ren)/ ward(s) to school. Similarly, if you drive to school to pick up your child(ren)/ ward(s) at the foyer, he/ she/ they should board the vehicle quickly and minimise the wait time of other parents who also drive to school to pick up their child(ren)/ ward(s).

# No Right Turn

Please take note of the "NO RIGHT TURN" sign in front of the school. Parents/ Guardians are not allowed to make a right turn upon exit from the school on Mondays to Fridays from **6.45 am to 7.45 am**. Pls refer to the attached Traffic Police Advisory.

### Parking Along Bukit Purmei Avenue at Dismissal

If you are picking up your child(ren)/ ward(s) after school by car, please park at the HDB carparks at Blk 108 and Blk 112, and walk to the Bukit Purmei side gate to wait for him/ her/ them. Alternatively, you may time your arrival after 1.45 pm so that you can drive into RMPS after the school buses have left. Please refrain from parking your vehicles along Bukit Purmei Avenue as it poses a danger to other road users and is also a hindrance to smooth traffic flow. We seek your co-operation and understanding to alleviate the inconvenience to the Bukit Purmei Avenue community, caused by illegal parking along the road, leading to traffic congestion.

# I. ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS

### **I1 EARLY DISMISSAL OF STUDENTS**

If there is a need for your child(ren)/ ward(s) to be dismissed early from school for valid reasons, please inform his/ her/ their Form Teachers at least one day in advance and make arrangements for him/ her/ them to be picked up by an adult. Please note that the school will not allow your child(ren)/ ward(s) to go home on his/ her/ their own before dismissal, in the absence of an accompanying adult. The adult designated to pick him/ her/ them up must sign him/ her/ them out at the General Office.

#### 12 DELIVERY OR COLLECTION OF PERSONAL BELONGINGS DURING OR AFTER SCHOOL HOURS

RMPS aims to cultivate our students as responsible and independent persons who take personal responsibility for his/ her/ their own belongings. Forgetfulness is common amongst students and is a sign that they lack personal responsibility. This must be addressed as it causes inconvenience to others when assistance is required to deliver or collect his/ her/ their belongings. We seek the understanding and cooperation of all teachers and parents/ guardians to reinforce this important expectation of personal responsibility.

Home-school partnership will be critical in this endeavour to inculcate personal responsibility in our students. We will remind teachers not to ask students to call home and request for the delivery of items they have forgotten to bring to school. Together, teachers and parents must message to the students that they must take personal responsibility and face the consequences of their actions or non-actions. However, we recognize that some items, e.g. wallets, spectacles or medication, are critical for our students. Therefore, the school will only facilitate delivery of critical items if necessary. In addition, students will only be able to retrieve items left in the classrooms on the next school day.

### **I3 BIRTHDAY CELEBRATIONS**

While we acknowledge the joy children have in celebrating their birthdays with their peers, this practice may pose a challenge to the school, in ensuring the hygiene standards of the food brought in and the well-being of our students, some of whom have specific food allergies. This practice may also lead to undesirable expectations amongst our students, which may in turn, result in unnecessary pressure on their parents. Birthday celebrations in school are not allowed. We seek your understanding and cooperation to partner the school in this matter.

# N. PHOTO-TAKING FOR P6 STUDENTS FOR THE SCHOOL SMART CARDS (SSC)

MOE will be conducting the yearly photo-taking exercise for all students in Primary One (P1) and Primary Six (P6) for the purpose of generating the School Smart Card (SSC). The photo-taking will be conducted by Transit Link's appointed vendor on behalf of MOE. The SSC serves as the student's identification card and can be used for concessionary travel on public transport and to borrow library books from the National Library Board and the school's library, amongst other usage.

The photo-taking session for our school is scheduled on **Thu**, **16.02.2023** and **Fri**, **17.02.2023**. Following the phototaking, P1 students will get their SSCs by end March 2023, while the photos for P6 students will be used for the printing of Secondary SSCs when they are promoted to Secondary One in 2024. For P1 students, while pending the receipt of the SSCs, students can continue to use the Child Concession Card for free travel on public transport until 30 April 2023.

Please be informed that all P1 and P6 students are required to be dressed in their school uniform for the phototaking session. Please also ensure that your child's/ward's hair is neat and tidy. If your child/ward is unable to attend the photo-taking session, the school will either arrange for him/her to have his/her photo taken on another day or request the parent/guardian to submit a softcopy photo to the school.
