E. TOTAL DEFENCE DAY COMMEMORATION AND EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS EXERCISE 2024

Schools commemorate Total Defence Day on 15 February each year to mark the fall of Singapore to the Japanese in 1942. In commemorating TDD, our students reflect on the importance of Total Defence as Singapore's best allround response to threats and challenges that confront Singapore (e.g. terrorism, pandemics, cyber-attacks, influence campaigns or economic crises). Students also reflect on the continuing relevance of the six pillars of Total Defence - Military Defence, Civil Defence, Economic Defence, Social Defence, Digital Defence and Psychological Defence - as well as the core message of every Singaporean standing together, each playing our part to protect Singapore and our shared way of life.

2024 marks 40 years of Total Defence (TD40) in Singapore. The focus for TD40 will be on Singaporean's readiness and resilience in the face of crises and disruptions. Total Defence underpins our ability to deal with the ever-evolving threats and challenges to Singapore. Every Singaporean plays a part in our daily lives to ensure that Singapore is prepared for crises and disruption.

The school has planned recess activities, an assembly programme, as well as class-based activities to help our students know the aspects of Total Defence and how they can play their part in each aspect. These activities will take place on 14 and 15 February 2024.

As part of the commemoration of TD40, schools will conduct a TD40 Exercise for students to experience simulations of possible disruptions to Singapore. Through the school-wide experience and classroom discussion, students will learn about:

- How to respond and in help one another calmly and responsibly in circumstances of disruption,
- The need for everyone in Singapore to be ready to respond to the ever-evolving threats and challenges to our nation,
- How everyone in Singapore can work together and play our part in Total Defence, in order to remain a strong, united and resilient people.

The TD40 Exercise in RMPS will be conducted via an **emergency preparedness exercise**. As part of the SGSecure framework to safeguard Singapore and our way of life, this exercise aims to ensure the safety and wellbeing of all students and staff by preparing them to respond to emergencies in the school premises and be familiar with the safety and evacuation procedures. SGSecure is a movement to build the resilience of our community and aims to sensitise, train and mobilise the community during emergencies.

SGSecure focuses on three core actions that every one of us can do during emergencies:

- Staying Alert (Vigilance) to prevent and to keep your family, friends and yourself safe in the event of an emergency.
- Staying United (Cohesion) through building strong ties in the community; cherishing and safeguarding Singapore's racial and religious diversity and harmony so that we can stand together in peacetime and crisis; and
- Staying Strong (Resilience) by being ready to deal with a crisis, being resilient as individuals and as a community, to help each other bounce back quickly after an emergency.
