B. HOLISTIC ASSESSMENT: PERSONAL QUALITITES & 21ST CENTURY COMPETENCIES ASSESSMENT IN REPORT BOOKS FROM 2022 ONWARDS

In a few weeks, all P1-P5 students will be receiving their report books. In our effort to provide a more holistic experience for our students, RMPS has put together a set of Personal Qualities (P1 – 5) and 21st Century Competencies (P2, 4 & 5 only) report as a part of our holistic assessment. These Personal Qualities and 21st Century Competencies are shaped from RMPS core values and MOE framework for 21st Century Competencies and Student Outcomes. These reports are derived from form and subject teachers' observations, interactions and engagements with their students through a range of school-based experiences, where platforms are curated to allow all students to learn, enact and demonstrate the required qualities and competencies.

The 21st Century competencies are assessed at key junctures (end of lower primary, end of middle primary and at Primary 5) to better track a child's growth and development of these key skills and competencies. All P2, 4 and 5 students will receive a 21st Century Competencies report in their report books reflecting their growth in the following 3 areas:















- Civic Literacy, Global Awareness and Cross-Cultural Skills
- Critical and Inventive Thinking
- Communication, Collaboration and Information Skills

In the report book, you will also find a section on Personal Qualities. These indicators will present your child's progress for the year in these four qualities of Creativity, Graciousness, Integrity, and Resilience. For more information about the Personal Qualities, you may refer to page 9 of the Student Diary 2022.

Parents are encouraged to have a conversation with your child on his/her progress within these domains. These conversations will be useful to help your child develop key dispositions, competencies, skills and values that will make them lifelong and future-ready learners.

2023 PRIMARY SCHOOL LEAVING EXAMINATION (PSLE) APPLICATION FOR ACCESS ARRANGEMENTS (AA) FOR STUDENTS WITH LEARNING / PHYSICAL DISABILITIES

(Mdm Malar Vizhi, YH-Upper Primary)

In the PSLE, students with learning or physical disabilities may apply for AA during the examination.

Learning Disabilities

Students with learning disabilities (e.g. Dyslexia, Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD), Autism Spectrum Disorder, etc) who wish to apply for Access Arrangements (e.g. extra-time) for the **2023 PSLE** are required to submit their applications through the school to the Singapore Examinations and Assessment Board (SEAB).

The application must be accompanied by a copy of a psychological / professional report that:

- states clearly the specific learning disability, as diagnosed by qualified professionals*;
- is current, i.e. the evaluation of learning needs arising from the disability should be completed **within three years** prior to the date of the PSLE (older reports should also be submitted if they are referred to in the updated report);
- provides relevant information pertaining to medical, developmental and educational history;
- describes the comprehensive testing and techniques used to arrive at the diagnosis, including
 evaluation dates and test results with subtest scores from measures such as cognitive ability, academic
 achievement, and information processing;
- describes the functional limitations supported by the test results;
- describes the specific AA requested, and provides a rationale for the student's need for the specified AA.

*Note: Professionals qualified to make the evaluation include educational psychologists, child/clinical psychologists, psychiatrists, occupational therapists and speech and language therapists. You may consult the MOE Psychologist if you require clarifications on psychological/professional reports.

Physical Disabilities

Students with physical disabilities (e.g. Hearing Impairment, Visual Impairment, Speech Impairment, and physical impairment such as Cerebral Palsy, etc) who wish to apply for Access AA for the **2023 PSLE** are also required to submit their applications together with a copy of a medical report from qualified professionals (which include registered medical practitioners, occupational therapists and speech and language therapists). The medical report must state the following:

- · when the disability was diagnosed;
- how the disability will affect the candidate's performance during examination; and
- the type of AA(s) that is/are required by the candidate during examination

Please note that a medical certificate (MC) from a doctor is **insufficient**.

Please note that the AA requests for the following are not allowed:

- Extra time for the PSLE Listening comprehension (LC) examination
- Reader for language subjects (Standard / Foundation English & Mother Tongue).

Annotation of Examination Certificates and Results Slips

On the PSLE certificates, the titles of subjects which were taken under AA would be annotated with a symbol. Explanations for the symbols are provided on the certificates.

The following two annotation symbols would be used:

(a) Exemption Symbol (#)

'The candidate was exempted from satisfying the full range of assessment objectives in this subject. Details may be obtained from the Singapore Examinations and Assessment Board.'

(b) Access Arrangement Symbol (+)

'The candidate sat for the subject under access arrangements. Details may be obtained from the Singapore Examinations and Assessment Board.'

Parents who wish to apply for any of the above Access Arrangements for the **2023 PSLE** are to submit the relevant documents to your child's 2023 form teacher by **04.1.2023**.
