- Students who commit offences will be responsible for their actions. Every effort will be taken to educate and help them to learn from their mistakes.






- When students commit more serious offences such as cheating, stealing, being openly defiant or fighting, the school can mete out consequences such as detention or suspension.
- Serious offences may also warrant a drop in the student's conduct grade. A student's conduct grade, awarded at the end of each semester. It is a form of recognition for good behaviour, or a reflection of a student's poor behaviour.



Edusave Merit Bursary



Edusave Good Progress Awards


Students who do not qualify for Edusave Merit Bursary, but showed the greatest improvement in learning dispositions in the course of the year and have demonstrated good conduct.







