B. GREETINGS FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

C. DEVELOPING POSITIVE HABITS

(Mr Chua WN, HOD Disc)

Radin Mas Primary School believes in the importance of inculcating strong values and a sense of personal responsibility and self-discipline. These values and dispositions are essential for a child's pursuit of excellence in all areas.

Our school rules and expectations may be found in our school website, and we encourage you to go through them with your children. We would like to highlight these key points:

Respect and Graciousness. At home and in school, these values are the foundation that we want all children to develop and live out. Encourage your children to show respect in deed and word to their peers and school staff. Remind them to be gracious by putting the needs of others before self.

Responsibility. We want our students to exercise ownership of the things they do and have. Encourage them to pack their own school bags. Being responsible also means how one values time; it also shows respect to others when one is on time. Students are expected to assemble by 7.40 am every day for flag-raising. The school will work with students who have issues with attendance and punctuality but habitual tardiness and absences from school, CCA or school events will impact a student's Conduct Grade.

Every student must wear their school uniform in accordance to the dress code. Students are permitted to wear the PE attire to school on days they have PE, PAL or CCA.

Students are discouraged from bringing smart devices such as mobile phones to school. Students are to keep their devices turned off during curriculum hours, unless permission is given by teachers. Students are only allowed to use their devices to make personal phone calls after school, and only at the canteen or the foyer.

D. TEMPERATURE-TAKING EXERCISE 2020

(Mdm SH Nisaa, AM)

As part of our measures to maintain schools' readiness to resume a temperature-taking exercise, the school will be conducting its first temperature-taking exercise in 2020 on **Thu, 16.01.2020 (Term 1, Week 2)**. Please ensure that your child's/ ward's Oral Digital Thermometer (ODT) is in good working condition. If the ODT is not working, a new one can be purchased from the RMPS bookshop at \$4.50 each. The school will be providing the 2020 Primary 1 students with new ODTs.

We seek your support and cooperation to ensure that your child/ ward brings his/ her ODT on the day of the Temperature-Taking Exercise. Together, we can conduct a successful temperature-taking exercise as part of our continuing efforts to provide a healthy and safe environment for all in our school.

Please cooperate by seeking medical attention for your child should he/ she develop any flu-like symptoms and refrain from sending him/ her to school until he/ she has fully recovered.

E. USAGE OF PERSONAL DATA

(Mr Saravanan S, HOD ICT (Covering))

Under the Personal Data Protection Act (PDPA), photograph(s) and video image(s) of an individual are considered personal data.

This is to notify parents/ guardians that photograph(s) or video image(s) of students and parents/ guardians of RMPS may be captured during school activities and events such as classroom lessons, CCA, school camps, Achievement Day, etc. The school may use and publish such photographs and/ or video recordings in school publications, website, social media channels, and other communication channels. However, these photographs and/ or video images will not be released to any third party without the individual's consent.

F. COMMUNICATION APPLICATION: PARENTS GATEWAY

(Mdm SH Nisaa, AM)

RMPS is currently using Parents Gateway - a one-stop mobile app for parents and school to better support their children's educational journey through improved communications. The centrally coordinated initiative, available on IOS and Android for parents, allows schools to send updates on programmes and activities. It also allows parents to perform administrative functions such as providing consent for their children to participate in school activities. Parents can use their SingPass accounts, SMS 2FA or OneKey Token to gain access to Parents Gateway. Through this dedicated account, parents will be able to receive information and perform administrative functions for their children, even if the children are in different classes, or from different schools. We require parents/ guardians to download the Parents Gateway application if you have not done so.

G. READING BEFORE MORNING ASSEMBLY

RMPS would like to promote a love for reading in our students in order to raise their language proficiency. Therefore, students will need to bring a Mother Tongue Language story book each on Mondays and Tuesdays, and an English Language story book each on Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays, for reading before morning assembly.

H. SAFETY & SECURITY

(Mr Kwok KL, VP(A))

In our continuous efforts to strengthen the school's safety and security, the following have been implemented. We seek the understanding of all parents/ guardians to adhere to the structures and processes we have put in place, for the enhanced safety and security of our students.

H1 DESIGNATED WAITING AREA FOR P1 PARENTS/ GUARDIANS DURING SCHOOL DISMISSAL

P1 parents/ guardians are to produce the P1 dismissal pass and proceed to wait at the waiting area located in the school canteen for their children/ wards during dismissal. Unauthorized personnel are not allowed beyond this designated waiting area. P2- P6 parents/ guardians are to wait at the waiting area nearer the school gate for their children's/ ward's dismissal.

H3 SEASON PARKING IN RMPS

All carpark lots in the school have been reserved for season parking holders. Due to limited lots available, the school may not be able to provide sufficient visitor parking to parents. The school seeks your cooperation to park at Blk 108 and Blk 112, and enter the school via the Bukit Purmei Avenue side gate and proceed immediately to the Security Guard Post for visitor's registration. We appreciate your understanding.

H4 TRAFFIC MATTERS

Students Alighting Along Lower Delta Road at Arrival

If you drive your child(ren)/ ward(s) to school in the morning, please do not allow him/ her/ them to alight along the Lower Delta Road and/ or Bukit Purmei Avenue as it poses a danger to him/ her/ them and other road users and is a hindrance to smooth traffic flow. Please drive into RMPS via Bukit Purmei Avenue so that your child(ren)/ ward(s) can alight at the foyer safely. We seek your understanding and cooperation to ensure his/ her/ their safety and well-being, as well as to be socially responsible by playing your part to prevent traffic congestion along Lower Delta Road and Bukit Purmei Avenue.

Strictly For Drop Off And Pick Up At The School Foyer

To facilitate the smooth flow of vehicles driving into RMPS for students to alight at arrival and for parents to fetch him/ her/ them at dismissal, please note of the "STRICTLY FOR DROP OFF AND PICK UP" signs at the foyer. If you drive your child(ren)/ ward(s) to school, please ensure that his/ her/ their bags are with them so that he/ she/ they can alight quickly on his/ her/ their own, at the foyer. This will ease traffic congestion leading into RMPS and minimise the wait time of other parents who are also driving their child(ren)/ ward(s) to school. Similarly, if you drive to school to fetch your child(ren)/ ward(s) at the foyer, he/ she/ they should board the vehicle quickly and minimise the wait time of other parents who also drive to school to fetch their child(ren)/ ward(s).

No Right Turn

Please take note of the "NO RIGHT TURN" sign in front of the school. Parents/ Guardians are not allowed to make a right turn upon exit from the school on Mondays to Fridays from 6.45 am to 7.45 am.

Parking Along Bukit Purmei Avenue at Dismissal

If you fetch your child(ren)/ ward(s) after school by car, please park at the HDB carparks at Blk 108 and Blk 112, and walk to the Bukit Purmei side gate to wait for him/ her/ them. Alternatively, you may time your arrival after 1.45 pm so that you can drive into RMPS after the school buses have left. Please refrain from parking your vehicles along Bukit Purmei Avenue as it poses a danger to other road users and is also a hindrance to smooth traffic flow. We seek your co-operation and understanding to alleviate the inconvenience to the Bukit Purmei Avenue community, caused by illegal parking along the road, leading to traffic congestion.

H5 EARLY DISMISSAL OF STUDENTS

If there is a need for your child(ren)/ ward(s) to be dismissed early from school for valid reasons, please inform his/ her/ their Form Teachers at least one day in advance and make arrangements for him/ her/ them to be fetched by an adult. Please note that the school will not allow your child(ren)/ ward(s) to go home on his/ her/ their own before dismissal, in the absence of an accompanying adult. The adult designated to fetch him/ her/ them must sign him/ her/ them out at the General Office.

H6 DELIVERY OR COLLECTION OF PERSONAL BELONGINGS DURING OR AFTER SCHOOL HOURS

Ensuring the upkeeping of personal belongings is a key strand in developing personal responsibility. To further cultivate and nurture this to be a personal habit, RMPS will enforce a non-delivery practice of **non-essential** items to your children and wards during curriculum hours. However, we recognize that some items, eg wallets, spectacles or medication, are critical for our students. Therefore, the school will only facilitate delivery of critical items if necessary. In addition, students will only be able to retrieve items left in the classrooms on the next school day. We will remind teachers not to ask students to call home and request for the delivery of items they have forgotten to bring to school. Together, teachers and parents must stress to the students that they must take personal responsibility and face the consequences of their actions or non-actions. We seek the understanding and cooperation of parents/ guardians to reinforce this important expectation of personal responsibility.

H7 BIRTHDAY CELEBRATIONS

While we acknowledge the joy children have in celebrating their birthdays with their peers, this practice may pose a challenge to the school, in ensuring the hygiene standards of the food brought in and the well-being of our students, some of whom have specific food allergies. This practice may also lead to undesirable expectations amongst our students which may in turn, result in unnecessary pressure on their parents. Birthday celebrations in school is not allowed. We seek your understanding and cooperation to partner the school in this matter.

L. P2 MY FIRST OUTDOOR CAMP

The PE Department's Outdoor Education programme at RMPS aims to equip our students with the necessary knowledge, skills and attitudes to explore the natural and urban environments safely and responsibly. Our P2 students will be embarking on their very first outdoor camp which is a day trip to Henderson Waves and Telok Blangah Hill Park on **Wed, 08.01.2020**. We hope to engage their sense of adventure through the exploration of both natural and urban environments in our neighbourhood.

The objectives of the P2 My First Outdoor Camp are to teach our students to appreciate nature and care for the environment around the school, and cultivate the value of respect for self and others by fostering positive relationships with their classmates and teachers. The highlight of the camp is a hike to Henderson Waves where students will be given opportunities to work in teams and be engaged in a variety of games and fun-filled activities to develop their problem solving, collaborative and communication skills.

As the day camp is part of our school's co-curriculum, every student is required to participate. Please be assured that your child will be in a safe environment and every possible measure will be taken to ensure his/ her safety during the camp. Students who are unable to attend the camp due to valid medical reasons must submit a letter of excuse with supporting document(s) to their Form Teacher. Please note that students who are unable to attend the camp will be required to report to school as usual. An alternative programme will be arranged for them.

M. P3 MODULAR CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES (CCAs)

(Mr Idham AA, HOD PE/ CCA/ Aes)

As part of a holistic education, our P3 students will be attending Modular CCA sessions in Semester 1, 2020. The objectives of Modular CCAs are to provide our students with further exposure in sports, performing arts and visual arts

lessons and also to serve as a platform for them to discover their interests and talent in 'alternative CCAs' not offered by the school.

The details of P3 Modular CCAs are as follows:

Day	12 Friday sessions, commencing 17.01.2020
Time	2.00 pm - 4.00 pm
Venue	Upper ISH – Floorball Music Room – Show Choir Art Rooms – Manga Drawing

Students will be divided into 3 groups (of 80 students per group). Each group will attend 4 consecutive sessions for each of the three modular CCAs on a rotational basis e.g.

Group A – **Floorball** (4 sessions)

Group B – **Show Choir** (4 sessions)

Group C – **Manga Drawing** (4 sessions)

Each group will rotate until all students have completed 12 sessions.

Once our P3 students have completed their Modular CCAs by the end of Semester 1, they will indicate their 3 choices of CCAs offered by the school in the online CCA Option Form. The school will ensure that every P3 student will be assigned a CCA within their 3 choices.

To summarise, P3 students will participate in 3 modular CCAs in Semester 1 and begin their regular CCA from Semester 2 onwards. The school will arrange for transport for those taking the school bus home.

N. P3 SWIMSAFER SWIMMING PROGRAMME

(Mr Idham AA, HOD PE/ CCA/ Aes)

The school will be conducting the SwimSafer 2.0 programme for all Primary 3 students. This programme aims to teach swimming proficiency and water survival skills to children in a fun and safe manner. It comes with a revised syllabus and assessment which includes an online theory test component. Lessons will be customised to suit students' ability level. These lessons are part of the school's Physical Education (PE) curriculum and students will attend the swimming lessons during their PE periods. For all swimming classes, there will be an instructor-child ratio of 1:10. Teachers and parent volunteers will also be present during the lessons to ensure that your child/ ward is well-supervised.

All P3 students, except those with valid medical reasons, are required to attend these swimming lessons which will be conducted at Queenstown ActiveSG Swimming Complex. If you would like to seek exemption for your child/ ward, please submit a letter of excuse with supporting documents to his/her PE teacher by **Fri, 10.01.2020**.

The cost of the programme is \$124.50 per student. After school subsidy, students need to co-pay only \$20.00. The amount payable will be reflected in the School Bill for P3 for 2020.

There will be a total of 10 practical sessions. The schedule of the swimming lessons for the respective P3 classes is shown in the table below:

TRAFFIC POLICE ADVISORY ON ALIGHTING OF PASSENGERS

Traffic Police has received numerous feedback from residents of Teresa Ville Condominium regarding vehicles stopping in the yellow box outside of their gate to alight passengers. Vehicles have also been observed to be remaining in the yellow box in front of bus stop B07 along Lower Delta, impeding the exit of the bus bay. This causes difficulty to motorists entering/ exiting from the compound/ bus bay.

2. Please note the penalty for the following offence:
 - B. Stopping a vehicle in such a manner as to cause unnecessary obstruction to other road users (yellow box) – compoundable fine of \$70.
3. Traffic Police would not hesitate to take necessary action against errant road users who flout traffic rules and regulations.
4. We seek your cooperation to alight your child/ ward at the designated drop-off points in the school or the surrounding vicinity without causing inconvenience to other road users. We believe that such considerate behaviour would go a long way to help make Singapore roads safer for all.
